### English

Students will participate in a variety of reading, writing, speaking and listening activities each morning. It is essential that your child arrives at school by the bell at 9:05 each day to ensure they do not miss out on important literacy instruction.

How can I help? It is beneficial for students to read books daily at home with some support from an adult or older sibling. This is an extremely important activity to develop your child's reading ability.

### Mathematics

Students will participate in a variety of hands-on mathematics games using concrete materials.

How can I help? Give your child real life examples of maths (e.g. shopping - counting, folding and cutting – fractions etc.)

# Other Key Learning Areas

During our afternoon sessions we will be learning about history, science, PD/H/PE and Creative Arts. This term we are looking at the following topics:

History - Personal and Family History

Creative Arts - Music, Drama, Dance and Visual Arts

Science - What is it made of?

PD/H/PE - Catching, throwing and child protection

**PBL** (Positive Behaviour for Learning) – Students will learn the class and school rules. Students participate in '**Safe Rap**' discussions **before** play at recess and lunch to prepare the students, making sure they have everything they need and that they are prepared for play in the playground. Students participate in a '**Safe Wrap Up**' discussion **after** playtimes to discuss any concerns and to recognise positive behaviour displayed in the playground.

The students receive a SRL (Safe, Respectful Learner) card which communicates to parents how your child is working and progressing at school. The card goes home each Friday and needs to be signed by a parent/carer and sent back to school every Monday.
